Thank you for your request, received on 8 August 2024, under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act) for the following information:

- 1. "Any briefings your organisation provided to the Energy Minister and/or his office on the market structure of the electricity market in the 2024 calendar year to date."
- 2. Any briefings your organisation provided to the Energy Minister in late July/early August about high energy prices.
- 3. Any briefings your organisation provided to the Energy Minister regarding the cost and viability of importing liquid natural gas in July and August."

The Electricity Authority Te Mana Hiko (Authority) has interpreted your request as for written briefings. Please note the Authority also meets regularly with the Minister for Energy to discuss the matters in the written briefings.

Request 1

The Authority has identified one document within the scope of your request. This is available on our website: Fortnightly report - 15 February 2024.pdf (ea.govt.nz). Therefore, you request is declined under section 18(d) as the information you have requested is publicly available.

Request 2

The Authority has interpreted "late July/early August" as between 22 July 2024 and 8 August 2024. The Authority has identified three documents within the scope of your request. These are Security of supply reports and will be published on our website: <u>Security of supply reports | Electricity</u> <u>Authority (ea.govt.nz)</u>. Therefore, you request is declined under section 18(d) as the information you have requested will soon be publicly available.

Request 3

The Authority did not provide the Minister for Energy with any Ministerial briefings within scope of this request. Therefore, your request is declined under section 18(e) as the information you have requested does not exist.
