Your request

Thank you for your request, received on 29 August 2025, under the Official Information Act 1982 (Act) for the following information:

I note that your rate is increasing by 800%. I have tried looking at your site to find:

- the fee that was charged in each of the last 10 years.
- why an 800% increase was necessary
- what the surcharge is spent on
- the amount spent v the amount collected.

Our response

For sake of clarity, I will respond to each part of your request in turn.

The fee that was charged in each of the last 10 years

This information is publicly available. All previous Electricity Authority Levy (EA Levy) annual rates can be found here: How we are funded | Electricity Authority.

why an 800% increase was necessary

This part of your request is refused under section 18(e) of the Act, as the information requested does not exist. On 1 October 2025, the EA Levy will increase from 0.14c per kWh to 0.16c per kWh. This is an increase of 14% or 0.02 cents per kWh.

what the surcharge is spent on
