Thank you for your request, received on 26 February 2026, under the Official Information Act 1982 (Act) for the following information:

- ***Any impact assessment or monitoring report on the Low User Fixed Charge phase-out affecting residential consumers.***
- ***Any review or formal assessment of retail electricity competition effectiveness in New Zealand.***
- ***The most recent document held showing projected Crown dividend revenue from partially state-owned electricity companies.***


